SUBJECT: Recommendations to Award RFP 2020-01 & RFP 2020-02 to EMDC

SUMMARY

The reason for this memo is to provide information on the selection of a One Stop Operator and recipient of Maine Department of Labor PY 20 Employment and Training Administration funds for the Adult, Dislocated Worker, and Youth Programs in Androscoggin, Franklin, Kennebec, Oxford, and Somerset counties. The total amount to be awarded is \$1,522,416

BACKGROUND & RATIONALE FOR PROCUREMENT METHOD

Consistent with Federal, State or Local Area regulations, a competitive procurement process is required for the selection of a One-Stop Operator once every four years and the selection of subrecipients to provide WIOA program services once every three years. This process has not happened for at least ten years.

On May 11, 2020, to satisfy these requirements, the CWMWDB issued RFP 2020-01 for a One Stop Operator and Adult/DW Program services provider and RFP 2020-02 for a Youth Program service provider. The anticipated funding amount of over \$550,000 for the youth program contract and nearly \$1 million for the OSO/Adult contract are both over the Simplified Acquisition Threshold of \$150,000. This makes each of these procurement processes a Level 1 acquisition.

The competitive proposal process is the preferred method for procuring goods and program services costing more than the current Single Acquisition Threshold such as a Level 1 acquisition. The competitive proposal process is the *required* process for procuring a One Stop Operator.



There are three types of competitive request processes that the CWMWDB can use for a Level 1 acquisition. There are requests for bids, requests for qualifications and requests for proposals. The type chosen is a request for proposal as the services in question have qualitative and quantitative characteristics. This method allows consideration of both.

PROPOSAL APPLICATIONS & INSTRUCTIONS

Detailed proposal documents and sample forms were assembled by CWMWDB staff and reviewed by MDOL prior to public release on May 11, 2020.

The proposal notices were widely promoted on social media. There were three published public notices in three newspapers, two press releases distributed to numerous online sources, five entries in Maine public archives and numerous promotions and native posts on Twitter, Facebook, LinkedIn, and Instagram. The RFP notice was posted on the website of the National Association of Workforce Boards and MDOL's Facebook page.

An optional bidder conference was held for each RFP on June 1, 2020. Question and answer procedures were established and used. An information notification procedure via email to bidders was used. Guidelines for ethical conduct were explicitly communicated.

SCORING

A Selection Committee of five advanced career workforce development industry experts was chosen in September 2019. This process was updated and discussed at quarterly board meetings of the CWMWDB and at "Executive Committee" and Chief Elected Official meetings. An RFP Chair was designated from the Board. Pursuant to the RFP Chair's instructions, an instructional packet advising each Selection Committee member of their role in the WIOA RFP process was emailed out on March 22, 2020.

On May 27, 2020, the Selection Committee was educated further in the particulars of our WIOA RFPs and the Scoring Process in Meeting 1. They used a detailed scoring matrix for the proposal elements. This matrix was part of each RFP and is attached to this memo. The nationally renowned Baldrige Framework of Excellence for Nonprofits scoring methodology was used for scoring guidance.

The Selection Committee held a total three meetings with each other. As mentioned above, the first meeting was instructional to review each RFP, the score sheet and the



Baldrige scoring guidance. The next two meetings involved discussion of the submitted proposals. Each Selection Committee member scored their own proposal and came to their own opinion using the scoring tool and its points as a guide.

It was decided by the Selection Committee that only applications that addressed the whole scope of the RFP would be considered in this process. Two of the five youth responses sought partial funding so therefore were not continued. This left three respondents in each of the two RFP categories: Eastern Maine Development Corporation, Goodwill and Western Maine Community Action.

There was a group discussion on each RFP. The process was wrapped up as each Selection Committee member disclosed their ranked bottom firms, not by score, but by ordinal - 3. The purpose was to see if there was consensus on who was not the selection so that discussion could be focused on the better perceived firms. The committee discussed their top ranked firm, ordinal - 1. There was a clear perceived winner. The Chair asked several questions of the committee members to ensure a bona fide and accurate result. Once satisfied, the Chair declared the floor open. A motion was made and seconded to recommend the results to the CWMWDB for action.

RESULTS

There were three proposals submitted in response to RFP 2020-01. There were five proposals submitted in response to RFP 2020-02. The Selection Committee unanimously, 5-0, recommended that the CWMWDB award funding for both RFP 2020-01 and RFP 2020-02 to the Eastern Maine Development Corporation.

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
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

EVICITION, RENT AND MORTGAGES

Gov. Janet Mills has signed an executive order to help Mainers stay in their homes and keep businesses open during the state of emergency. The order prevents the immediate eviction of tenants other than those who engage in dangerous or unlawful

conduct. It also strengthens the penalties for landlords who may try to evict tenants illegally, and extends the time frame for the eviction process in case courts reopen before the state of emergency is terminated.

The state has partnered with MaineHousing to create the COVID-19 Rent Relief Program for Mainers who cannot pay their rent because of the coronavirus outbreak. The \$5 million program will allow households that meet certain income and ability to pay requirements to receive a one-time payment up to \$500 to be paid directly to their landlord. Mills also urged financial institutions to work with homeowners and small businesses. Mills asked them to avoid initiating residential and commercial foreclosures and pause any open proceedings during this time.

HOW DO I FILE FOR UNEMPLOYMENT?

Lawmakers have passed an emergency law that includes benefits for displaced employees who intend to return to the same employer. It waives the requirement that they search for a job, as well as a weeklong waiting period to be eligible for benefits.

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
